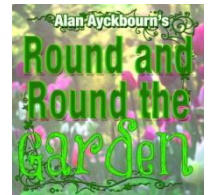

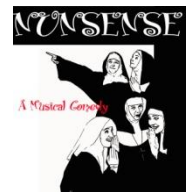

Jan 28 – Feb 14, 2016

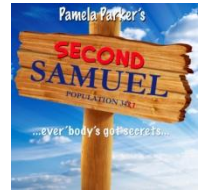

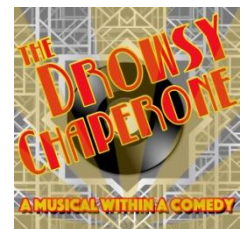
