About the Application Process

Step 1: Apply to the college (<http://www.com.edu/admissions/apply>)

- Submit **official** transcripts and a **Transcript Evaluation Form** to COM Admissions Department for all colleges attended (except COM)
- Allow at least 2 weeks for the evaluation to be completed (during peak times, allow 2-3 months)
- All transferred courses must be uploaded into the Student Information System (SIS) to be eligible for admission to nursing

Step 2: Meet with an academic advisor in the Student Success Center to review the pre-nursing academic plan

Step 3: Meet all eligibility requirements for application to the ADN Program Pre-Licensure Track

- Meet college ready TSI requirements for Reading, Writing, and Math
- Complete all prerequisite courses with a final grade of **C or higher**
 - ENGL 1301 Composition I
 - PSYC 2301 Introduction to Psychology
 - BIOL 2401 Human Anatomy and Physiology I
 - BIOL 2402 Human Anatomy and Physiology II
 - BIOL 2420 Microbiology
- Earn a prerequisite grade point average (GPA) of *at least 2.80*
- Complete the online pre-nursing orientation session (<http://www.com.edu/nursing/pno>) (valid for 6 months from date of completion)




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Step 4: Request Nursing Application Release

- When Steps 1-3 are **completed**, submit an email to nursing@com.edu with all of the following information:
 - Subject: *Request for Nursing Application Release*
 - Full name: First Middle Last
 - Other names used, if any
 - COM ID#
 - Mailing address
 - Phone number(s)
 - COM email address
 - Home email address
 - Program: ADN Program Pre-Licensure Track
 - Term/Year: Fall/20xx or Spring/20xx

Step 5: Apply for admission in WebAdvisor by 1700 (5 p.m.) on the desired deadline date and track your application status throughout the ranking & selection

- Fall Admission - **May 15th** or Spring Admission - **August 15th**
- Applicants are ranked for selection based on the ranking score formula:



*Highest education level only – Must be documented on a transcript or certificate of completion submitted to the COM Admissions Department

- Check “Application Updates” on the ADN Program Pre-Licensure Track webpage during the selection process
- Login to WebAdvisor to track your application status during the selection process
- **ALL** communication from the Nursing/Allied Health Department will be sent to your official **COM email address**

Step 6: Get electronic copies of these documents ready for upload if accepted for admission

- Immunization record(s)** showing proof of:
 - Hepatitis B Virus (HBV) positive titer** (The series of three injections normally takes 7 months to complete.)
 - Measles, mumps and rubella positive titers**
 - Varicella (chicken pox) positive titer**
 - Influenza** (flu) immunization for current flu season
 - Current combined **Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis** (Tdap) immunization within the past 10 years (Td alone is not acceptable.)
- Tuberculin Skin Test** (PPD) results
(A negative PPD reading within the last year is required or a negative chest X-ray if you have a history of previous positive PPD.)
- Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR)** certification - American Heart Association (AHA) for Health Care Providers only
(Contact CE-Allied Health Program at 409-933-8645 for class information.)
- Criminal Background Checks**
 - Blue card or letter from the Texas Board of Nursing
 - PreCheck payment receipt
- Drug Screen** payment receipt for drug screen
