Licensed vocational nurses provide compassionate care to patients in long-term care facilities and visitors to doctors' offices. As the U.S. population ages, demand for vocational nurses continues to increase.

## **About the Program**

The COM Vocational Nursing Program prepares students for rewarding careers through hands-on classes, labs, and clinical experiences at health care facilities. Professors teach small classes, are available for extra help, and dedicate themselves to students' success. A nursing tutor is available for individual and group sessions at no cost to the student.

## **About the Application Process**

## Step 1: Apply to the college (<a href="http://www.com.edu/admissions/apply">http://www.com.edu/admissions/apply</a>)

- Submit **official** transcripts and a **Transcript Evaluation Form** to COM Admissions Department for all colleges attended (except COM)
- Allow at least 2 weeks for the evaluation to be completed (during peak times, allow 2-3 months)
- All transferred courses must be uploaded into the Student Information System (SIS) to be eligible for admission to nursing

# Step 2: Meet with an academic advisor in the Student Success Center to establish a pre-nursing academic plan

# Step 5: Apply for admission in WebAdvisor by 1700 (5 p.m.) on September 15<sup>th</sup> and track your application status throughout the ranking & selection process

• Applicants are ranked for selection based on the ranking score formula:

- Check "Application Updates" on the VN Program webpage during the selection process
- Login to WebAdvisor to track your application status during the selection process
- ALL communication from the Nursing/Allied Health Department will be sent to your official COM email address

## Step 6: Get electronic copies of these documents ready for upload if accepted for admission

☐ <b>Hepatitis B Virus (HBV)</b> positive titer (The series of three injections normally takes 7 months to complete.)
☐ Measles, mumps and rubella <u>positive</u> titers
☐ Varicella (chicken pox) <u>positive</u> titer
☐ Influenza (flu) immunization for current flu season
☐ Combined <b>Tetanus</b> , <b>Diphtheria and Pertussis</b> (Tdap) immunization within the past 10 years (Td alone is not acceptable.)
☐ Tuberculin Skin Test (PPD) results
(A negative PPD reading within the last year is required or a negative chest X-ray if you have a history of previous positive PPD.)
☐ Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) certification - American Heart Association (AHA) for Health Care Providers only.
