1. PURPOSE

This Regulation identifies the steps the College will follow to support a drug-free campus.

3. REGULATION

3.1 Standards of conduct regarding the possession, use, and distribution of alcohol and drugs.

3.2 Disciplinary sanctions for students and employees in violation of the standards of conduct. Advising students of the legal sanctions under local, State and Federal law that can be invoked for unlawfully manufacturing, dispensing, distributing, possession, or use of controlled substances. These sanctions include referral for prosecution, fines, and incarceration commensurate with the offense.

3.3 Description of legal sanctions under local, state, and/or federal law.

3.4 Description of health risks associated with drug and alcohol abuse. Informing students of the significant health risks including addiction, chronic disability and even death that are associated with the use of controlled substances and alcohol. Information concerning these risks is available in the Student Success Center.

3.5 Description of the drug and alcohol counseling and treatment resources available to students and employees. Providing confidential referrals for counseling, treatment, and rehabilitation through the Student Success Center. Providing educational programs and courses to inform students of the dangers of drug and alcohol abuse.
