Expectations of Industrial Steering Committee Members:

- Seriously consider graduates for job openings for which they are qualified
- Host at least one meeting per year at your site
- Provide at least one mentor to CHS students
- Participate on one sub-committee
- Provide at least one employee for 1-2 days to develop specific curriculum
- Complete and report on off-line assignments timely
- Attend as many scheduled meetings as possible
- Attend one school career day
- Promote the program internal to your organization

Expectations of School District Steering Committee Members:

- Relentlessly promote the program to your students
- Do what you can to streamline the process for students to successfully transfer from your ISD to the CHS
- Participate on one sub-committee
- Attend as many scheduled meetings as possible
- Make sure the program is well represented at school career days

Expectations of CHS Staff Committee Members:

- Relentlessly promote the program in the community
- Coordinate Steering Committee and sub-committee meetings and events efficiently and effectively
- To the extent possible, make sure the needs of all stakeholders are met when decisions about the program are made
- Attend as many scheduled meetings as possible
- Make sure the program is well represented at ISD career days
