About the Application Process

Step 1: Apply to the college (http://www.com.edu/admissions/apply)

- Submit official transcripts and a Transcript Evaluation Form to COM Admissions Department for all colleges attended (except COM)
- Allow at least 2 weeks for the evaluation to be completed (allow 2-3 months during peak times)
- All transferred courses must be in the Student Information System (SIS) to be eligible for admission to nursing

Step 2: Meet with an academic advisor in the Student Success Center

- Select a nursing program and track
- Review the pre-nursing academic plan
- The nursing application link will be visible in WebAdvisor after this meeting, but will not be accessible until after completing Step 3

- *Education Points (Master's Degree, Bachelor's Degree, Associate's Degree, Health-Related Certificates)

- Login to WebAdvisor to track your application status during the selection process

A negative PPD reading within the last year or a negative chest X-ray within the last 5 years if you have a history of previous
positive PPD.
☐ Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) card from the American Heart Association (AHA) for Health Care Providers only

Notice to Students Regarding Licensing

Effective September 1, 2017, HB 1508 amends the Texas Occupations Code Section 53 that requires education providers to notify potential or enrolled students that a criminal history may make them ineligible for an occupational license upon program completion.
