Step 1: Apply to the college (<http://www.com.edu/admissions/apply>). **Select General Studies Pre-Nursing as the major.**

- Submit **official** transcripts and a **Transcript Evaluation Form** to COM Admissions Department for all colleges attended (except COM)
- Allow at least **2 weeks** for the evaluation to be completed (allow **2-3 months** during peak times)
- All transferred courses must be in the Student Information System (SIS) to be eligible for admission to nursing
- If you have taken nursing classes at a different school, contact the Nursing Advisor to apply as a transfer student into the nursing program.

Step 2: Apply to the one of the ADN Full-Time Track Program.

- Go to www.com.edu.
- Click on **WebAdvisor**.
- Click on **Nursing Applications Directory**.
- Start your **New Application** (You may have more than one application open at a time if you are applying to multiple programs).



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- Follow the instructions throughout the nursing applications. Please send eligible certificates to nursingappdocs@com.edu after you have entered them into the application. You will not be given points for Degrees if they are not on file with the Admission Department. You will not be given points for eligible certificates if they are not on file with the Nursing Department.

You must have the following to apply to the ADN Program. You will be required to submit additional clinical readiness documentation if you are accepted into the program or if you are selected as an alternate:

- BIOL 2401 Human Anatomy and Physiology I
- Score at least 75% or greater on the following sections of the HESI A2: Math, Reading, Grammar, and Basic Vocabulary (Students may only submit one set of results per application period. Results are only valid for three years). Students applying for **both**, the **ADN and VN** programs should take the HESI A2 sections required for the **ADN program**.

- TSI College Ready
- Earn a prerequisite grade point average (GPA) of *at least 2.00*
- Proof of one Hepatitis B series (three vaccinations in total). A positive titer will be required if accepted to the program. The titer must be the **HBsAg titer**. If the titer is negative and the applicant has documentation of only one Hep B series, the series must be restarted.
- Annual flu vaccination.
- Proof at least two MMR vaccines and/or serological testing. If a titer is submitted, the positive titer must be **MMR IgG**.
- Proof of Varicella vaccines and/or positive serological testing. If a titer is submitted, the positive titer must be **VZV Ab IgG**.
- Proof of Tdap vaccination within the past 10 years.
- Proof of Tuberculosis screen (must be PPD, Chest X-Ray, or Quantiferon serological test).
- Proof of Basic Life Support (BLS) course completed within the past year. The BLS course must be completed through the American Heart Association. College of the Mainland offers American Heart Association BLS courses. Contact CE-Allied Health Program at 409-933-8645 for class information.
- **Spring 2020 Application Open Date:** January 15th, 2019
- **Spring 2020 Application Deadline:** September 16th, 2019

Applicants are ranked for selection based on the following:

***Education Points (Doctorate, Master's Degree in Science or Arts, Bachelor's Degree in Science or Arts, Associate's Degree in Science or Arts, and Health-Related Certificates).** Approved Health-Related Certificates are Certified Nursing Assistant, Emergency Medical Technician, Medical Assistant, Paramedic, and Licensed Vocational Nursing Certification. Certificates must be current and approved by a state agency to be considered for points. A degree must be health related. Points will only be awarded for the highest/certificate submitted.



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Notice to Students Regarding Licensing

Effective September 1, 2017, HB 1508 amends the Texas Occupations Code Section 53 that requires education providers to notify potential or enrolled students that a criminal history may make them ineligible for an occupational license upon program completion. This information is being provided to all persons who apply or enroll in the program, with notice of the requirements as described above, regardless of whether or not the person has been convicted of a criminal offense. Additionally, HB 1508 authorizes licensing agencies to require reimbursements when a student fails to receive the required notice.
